The 21st annual presentation of En Plein Air was held on Sunday, August 10th from 10:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. in and around Court House Square in Historic Owego. Various artists' works were available for purchase as well as for viewing. Participants exhibited and sold works in oil, acrylics, watercolors, mixed media, pastels, graphics and photography. Local artist, Bob Merwin, received the \$300 “Best of Show” award.

HICKORY SMOKED MUSIC FESTIVAL 8

The Hickory Smoked Music Festival 8 in Owego celebrated its second year of returning to the blues as it presented a great line-up of new and returning artists to the bandshell at Hickories Park in Owego on July 26, hosted by Visions Federal Credit Union and the Tioga County Council on the Arts.

MTB (Making The Band), a group of Owego Free Academy musicians under the direction of Dan Fabricious, was the first to perform, followed by the Royal Blues, a local band directed by Don VanScoy. Also appearing were the Riolo Brothers, The Blue J's, Outta Time Blues and national headliners, Miss E. C. Scott, Roomful of Blues and Roosevelt Dean.

The skies had been threatening for most of the day and a storm arrived shortly after Miss E. C. Scott went on stage for a 6:30 pm performance. The storm produced heavy rain and hail, along with lightening and the show was shut down for a short period. Audience members took shelter under the bandshell or returned to their cars until the storm passed.

After the storm Roomful of Blues took the stage for a rousing performance. Roomful of Blues previously performed at Hickory Smoked Blues, and was actually featured in the very first blues festival held at Hickories Park in Owego.

Windsor is known for contributing its sons to the Civil War, as a way station on the Underground Railway transporting slaves to freedom, and as the buggy whip manufacturing capital of New York during the late eighteen and early nineteen hundreds. More recently, the Village has become home to the Windsor Whip Works Art Gallery in a renovated a two-story 1874 Italianate building. The gallery is featuring nineteen artists, to include sculpture, printmaking, photography, and paintings in oils, watercolor and acrylic. Windsor is nestled in the western Catskills 15 miles east of Binghamton on State Route 17 at Exit 79. Parking is available in designated areas and on the streets of the Village.
